### **Play with Illustration**

*Ann James, Anna Walker, Auntie Fay Muir, Nicki Greenberg*

Circulate between mini activities with these talented creators for hands on experience and “take away” techniques

### **Digital Stories**

*Presented by Geelong Regional Library Staff*

In this workshop you will explore Storybird and use images and video to create visual stories inspired by classic picture books. This workshop will take place in a computer lab, there is no need to bring your own device.

### **Film Shorts**

This workshop uses picture books as stimulus for a short film. iPads will be provided in groups for this session and iMovie for editing. We will storyboard the plot points of the chosen text and then participants will create a short film based on this storyboard.

### **Novel ideas with literature**

*Shivaun Plozza, Mark Smith, Scot Gardner*

What are the ingredients of a great YA/teenage novel? In this session, three of Australia’s best YA writers – Shivaun Plozza, Scot Gardner and Mark Smith – will talk plot, setting, character and keeping it real for a young audience. This is an interactive workshop that will draw on the knowledge and expertise of participants to create the outline for a hypothetical YA novel.

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
